We have decided to extend the activity within the group to include any craft work as well as art.


We all do our 'own thing' whether it is painting or any craft activity, learning new skills from each other.

This summer Arlington Court is celebrating the incredible journey of Rosalie Chichester and her companion Chrissie Peters during their 1920-21 world tour.

Running from the 17 July to the 1 September this exhibition invites visitors to explore the fascinating stories and artifacts collected by these pioneering women.

Rosalie, whose family owned the Arlington estate for over 500 years, started this remarkable journey from Liverpool to Quebec on July 28, 1920. Her travels with Chrissie spanned eight countries over nine months and visitors can learn about the locations they visited, the animals encountered, and the shells collected along the way.

- Follow the story of Rosalie and Chrissie's world tour on display in the house. Learn about their remarkable journey and locations visited.
- Try your hand at arranging a Victorian-style shell display and see the displays of the shells collected during Rosalie's travels.
- Learn how to make an origami paper boat, share your own travel story and add it to the growing display hanging in the Staircase Hall.
