### Arlington Court Linocut Christmas Card Printing with Lizzie Mee -Sat 3rd December 10.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.

Be guided by Lizzie and create a one or two layered Christmas card using linocut techniques.

You will have a go at drawing, cutting and printing to create your own unique card and learn about how to use Christmas patterns, or have a go at your own Christmas scene.

You will get about ten A6 cards from the day but you'll also have your own lino design to take away with you and reuse again and again.

Bring your own ideas for your card and I'll help you realise your vision, or enjoy some of the shapes, patterns and card ideas that I bring with me.

This day is fine for beginners but if you've done a bit before you could try a more complex design! It's up to you. Price includes entry to Arlington grounds.

### Casting the Runes - Two Ghost Stories by M R James - Sat 3rd Dec 7.30 p.m. to 9.00 p.m.

Robert Lloyd Parry performs two ghost stories of M R James in the Staircase Hall at Arlington Court.

Montague Rhodes James [1862 – 1936] wrote his ghost stories to perform to friends in the years leading up to WW1. Today they have lost nothing of their power to terrify and amuse. Nunkie Theatre Company performs two of James's very best, in a thrilling one-man show – the scarcelybelievable fifth instalment of The M R James Trilogy.

In Casting the Runes we meet the unforgettable 'Abbot of Lufford, 'Mr. Karswell – magic lanternist, historian of the occult, and scourge of the academic establishment.
