Parracombe

We have lots of information for you this month about the 'goings on' in Parracombe Village.

Parracombe

The Pavilion Stores and Café is a community funded and run enterprise, born out of villager demand after the previous privately owned shop ceased trading in 2017 due to the retirement of the owners. To fund the project, the community were invited to invest in shares which were match funded by Power to Change and grant applications were made to a variety of organisations such as the Princes Countryside Fund. We employ a full-time manager but the remainder of the shop staff are volunteers of which we currently have 40 in number. The opening of The Pavilion Stores and Café has shown how a small community can bring about change for the better by pulling together and putting in some hard work.

We aim to source goods as locally to us where possible, ensuring that basic needs, as well as little treats, are available.

Our local goods include Honey from the Heddon Valley, Smoked Bacon Jam from Lynton which is delicious with the Devon cheeses we sell, fresh salads from Kentisbury, Beef, Pork and Lamb from local farmers and spirits from Exmoor Distillery in Dulverton. Local homemade savouries such as pasties and scotch eggs are available from the café menu alongside a wide variety of freshly baked delicious cakes.

There is a dresser full of local crafts which change on a bimonthly basis. Craftspeople who have sold their wares include local potters, woodcrafters, wool workers, foragers, painters and photographers.

We like to think of the Pavilion Stores and Café as a social space and a community hub for all to gather together as well as a shop. Events take place regularly in the café such as Chess Club, Bridge, Knit & Natter and Jigsaw club.
